Staff Report Land Development Code Text Amendment ZON 24-0020



Applicant: Clay County Planning and Zoning Division

Introduction

This county-initiated amendment to Article III of the Land Development Code is to amend portions of Section 3-5, Conditional Uses to create a new conditional use of Rural Event Venue and to permit the Rural Event Venue use as a Conditional Use in Branan Field Rural Suburbs, Lake Asbury Rural Community land uses and in Agricultural and Agricultural/Residential zoning districts.

Description

As part of the ongoing effort to update the County Land Development Code, planning and zoning staff is proposing a change to Sec. 3-5 Conditional Use. The proposed change would add a new conditional use, Rural Event Venue, to Sec. 3-5. This new conditional use would be permitted in the Branan Field Rural Suburbs land use, the Lake Asbury Rural Community land use, the Agricultural zoning district and the Agricultural/Residential zoning district.

Overview of Rural Event Venue Conditional Use

- Uses allowed under the Rural Event Center, Youth Camp and/or Retreat Center. Ownership may be private for-profit or not-for-profit.
- Minimum 50 acres in size
- Access by paved road
 - Perimeter buffer min. width 75 ft. Type B buffer requirements
 - Must receive approval as Rural Event Venue prior to commencing operations from the Planning and Zoning Division
 - RV site may comprise up to 20% of property (max density of 12 RV sites per acre)
- RV design guidelines consistent with Campground and Youth Camp conditional use
- Provisions of Sec. 15-5 of the Clay County Code (Noise) will apply for amplified or percussive sound except for Thursday between 5 p.m. and 10 p.m., Friday and Saturdays between 9:00 a.m. and 11:00 p.m. and Sundays between 10 a.m. and 5:00 p.m.

Proposed Text for Rural Event Venue (Sec. 3-5 (bl)

The draft propose text of the Rural Event Venue is as follows: 39 40 (bm) Rural Event Venue. 41 (1) For purposes of this subsection, a Rural Event Venue shall mean a venue located on 42 land within the Branan Field Master Plan with a land use designation of Rural 43 Suburbs, land within the Lake Asbury Master Planned with land use designation of 44 Rural Community, land zoned Agriculture or land zoned Agricultural/Residential 45 within which the following uses are permitted: 46 47 (i) The uses permitted under the rural event center conditional uses category 48 elsewhere provided in this Section 3-5(bk) including the congregation of 49 people in exchange for remuneration for events that include weddings, 50 reunions, retreats and picnics or other similar events or celebrations, together 51 with food, beverage and sundries vendors engaged for an event. 52 53 The uses permitted under the youth camp conditional use elsewhere provided 54 (ii) in this Section 3-5(bv), which may be undertaken in exchange for 55 remuneration. 56 The uses permitted under the retreat center conditional use elsewhere 57 (iii) provided in this Section 3-5(bh), which may be undertaken in exchange for 58 remuneration. 59 60 (2) Definitions - For the purposes of this subsection, the following words and phrases 61 shall have the meanings ascribed to them by this subsection: 62 63 (i) Cabin - means a structure that is permanently affixed to the ground and not 64 intended as long-term residence. Structures shall comply with all applicable 65 building codes and regulations adopted by the Board of County 66 Commissioners and the State of Florida. 67 68 Cabin site - means a parcel of land which is utilized for a cabin. Cabin sites (ii) 69 shall be shown on an approved site plan in accord with this section. 70 71 (iii) Recreational Vehicle - means, for the purpose of this section, a vehicular 72 portable structure built on a chassis, designed to be used as a temporary 73 dwelling for travel, recreation or vacation uses, permanently identified as an 74 RV by the manufacturer of the vehicle and shall include: 75 76

| 206 | | a. Tent sites should be clustered away from RV sites to minimize noise and |

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| 214 | (xiii) | No RV, cabin, or tent shall be considered to be a permanent resident, and occupancy |
| 215 | | shall be limited to 180 consecutive days, and no more than 200 days in any one year. |
