Chairman Mark Wright called the meeting to order at 9:31 am.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES

Chairman Mark Wright made a motion for approval of the November 1, 2024, PSCC meeting minutes, seconded by Director Stephanie Wright, which carried unanimously.

Chairman Mark Wright recognized former Chairman-Director Joe Bucci, spoke about the intent and purpose of the PSCC meetings, and expressed his appreciation to everyone for their involvement.

NEW BUSINESS

Current Status of the Clay County Detention Facility (Chief Arnold-CCSO)

Lieutenant Charles Harwood, addressed the Council to provide the current status of the CC Detention Facility.

- 386 Inmates
 - ∘ 87%: Felonies
 - 13%: Misdemeanors
 - 88 Sentenced to CC Jail
 - 21 Sentenced to DOC

There were questions and discussions regarding the expansion and remodeling of the jail, i.e., new architect, revamping of plans with the intent to have the plans completed by April, and timeline for moving forward with construction.

3. Clay County Detention Facility Mental Health (Patty Atkinson)

Patty Atkinson, Program Unit Supervisor, addressed the Council to provide details and information regarding the update CC Detention Facility - programs and mental health.

Topics Discussed:

 Job Fair - Took place in November with nine (9) vendors attending and forty-four (44) inmates

- PowerPoint Certification Test Eight (8) inmates passed 7 Males and 1 female
- Next test Microsoft Word
- GED Test Four (4) male inmates took three parts and have passed
- Final portion of the GED Test is today for two of those inmates Two (2) females were tested and one passed three portions and the other passed one portion -Both were released prior to completing the test
- Eight (8) inmates were placed in various sober living facilities To date six (6) have been successful
- Update for grant money regarding the Vivitrol program
- State IDs process have begun

There were questions and discussion regarding clarification for the State ID, substance abuse dorms funding, possible assistance needed from the Council, ready-for-work programs offered and job fair success.

4. Clay County Detention Facility Re-Entry Program

Prior to the update for the re-entry program, Taylor Clever, Clay County Facilities Construction Manager, provided more details and information for the construction of the jail.

There were comments, questions, and discussions to clarify the purpose of the project - expansion on the 2nd and 3rd floor to increase inmate areas, intent to add approximately 100 more beds, timeline for the construction to be completed, and design intent - only to add beds.

Lieutenant Harwood provided more details regarding the possible future design for dorms on the 3rd floor - visitation - first appearance - vivitrol program, and details regarding the Veterans dorm that is in place, as well as changes to the kitchen.

More questions and discussions were had to clarify the dorm for the Vivitrol program, the Veterans dorm and requirements/rules, a process for identifying inmates as veterans, adding information (Red stamp) on the booking sheet to signify the inmate is a veteran, plans to update visitation area for attorneys, the addition of new "pods," and new devices offered to inmates.

Margaret Pittenger, Medical Services Manager, addressed the Council to provide an update regarding the CC Detention Facility mental health and Re-Entry Program.

Topics Discussed:

- Mental Health Counselor PRN and is a Contracted Individual Licensed
- New Hire for Mental Health Unlicensed Social Worker
- 25% of the population is mental health
- The need for more than a PT Counselor

- Change in a position due to budget
- Partnership with HealthCred Care Insurance for inmates Exclusively designed for correctional facilities

There were questions and discussions to clarify regarding the process/procedure for the insurance, continued care, medication distribution, cost of insurance once released and during incarceration, how and why the program started, and the positive impact of the program.

Keia Mills, Manager for Clay County Probation and Parole, provided details and information to the Council regarding reducing the jail population and helping with public safety.

Topics Discussed:

- Face It Program Probationers come back to get reinstructed on their conditions of supervision, i.e., resources offered and any special conditions, expectations, etc.
- Operation New Hope Partnership Coordinating to help with housing

Comments and discussions were had regarding the positive impact of the Face-It program, access for DOC to contact inmates who will be on probation, inmates sentenced to DOC and efficiency of inmates being moved, request for the Council to tour the jail, and the projected date for the next PSCC meeting - April 25, 2025.
